

Hebridean Hostellers

Membership of the Gatliff Hebridean Hostellers is open to all who share our aims. We are a charitable Trust run entirely by volunteers (we have no paid staff). All profits go towards maintaining & improving the hostels. The Trust is dedicated to encouraging all, but especially young people of limited means, to appreciate the unique Gaelic culture, crofting economy and spectacular environment of the Outer Hebrides.

The charges at our hostels are kept low. There is also a reduction for those aged 17 and younger. This means that our historic and uniquely located hostels are available to all but especially young travellers of limited means.

The Gatliff Hostels are run in partnership with islanders, some of whom act as our wardens.

Simple Hostels

The Trust is responsible for three hostels in the islands: Berneray, Howmore and Rhenigidale. Two of the three are traditional thatched houses, the other is a slate roofed stonebuilt house.

The original blackhouses consisted of a large room, centred on a peat fire with smoke curling up through a hole in the roof, and a byre for cattle. Not surprisingly, therefore, all our main hostel buildings are simple structures with two main rooms, one of which is a kitchen/common room. All have washrooms & showers with hot & cold water. All have multi-fuel stoves & storage heaters.

We have gone beyond our original idea, which was to provide a haven from the vagaries of the Hebridean weather, somewhere to cook a meal, dry clothes, rest and enjoy the company of like minded travellers. But our facilities remain adequate but simple.

All our hostels are self catering with cooking by either calor gas or electricity.

No advanced bookings

We can take no advanced bookings but you are unlikely to be turned away. Our hostels are rarely full. Besides there are some spare mattresses/camp beds at our hostels.

When you arrive at the hostel find an empty bed and make it up using the duvet provided and a sleeping bag. (It is possible to hire sleeping bags at our hostels.)

Camping

It is possible to camp at all our hostels. The charge is a little over half the adult bed-night fee.

Membership

By becoming a members of the Trust you are helping to support the on-going work of the Trust. You also get invitations to our AGM and members' forum.

You are kept informed about the work of the Trust, notably by our twice yearly Hebridean Hosteller's newsletter. Our annual newsletter from the crofters' hostels is now published on our web site.

Becoming a volunteer

Everyone involved in running the Trust is a volunteer, so why not consider joining us? The volunteer effort is a vital ingredient in maintaining the unique atmosphere (the 'Gatliff difference') at our hostels and it keeps our overheads down.

There is a role for people who have project management experience, experience of running hostels or even small businesses and who can be in the islands on a regular basis, sort out issues on the ground and/or do practical work at the hostels. It is a misnomer to think of volunteering solely in terms of doing physical labour at the hostels. There is plenty to do behind the scenes which can be done from member's own homes. All you need is knowledge of & commitment to the hostels.

Whilst it is essential for volunteers to work on their own initiative, it is equally essential that they work within the agreed strategies, budget, priorities and policies of the Trust. The Trust cannot ask volunteers to carry out electrical, plumbing or gas work at the hostels because these task have to be carried out by tradesmen with professional accreditation. However, volunteers with the drive, time and skills, are required to take ownership of specific projects and act as project managers for activities central to the running of the Trust and the improvement of the hostels.

Gift Aid
